## Partial Amendment No. 1 to SR-ISE-2017-106

On December 6, 2017, Nasdaq ISE, LLC ("ISE" or "Exchange") filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC" or "Commission") a proposed rule change ("Proposal") to permit the listing and trading of options based on 1/5 the value of the Nasdaq-100 Index on a twelve month pilot basis. The SEC published the Proposal in the Federal Register for notice and comment on December 26, 2017.<sup>1</sup>

The Exchange is filing this Partial Amendment No. 1 to modify the Proposal, as follows:

- 1) The last full sentence on page 12 of the 19b-4, and on page 28 of the Exhibit 1, reads: "The data would include a calculation of percentage prices changes for various time intervals and compare that information to the respective control sample." Immediately following that sentence, the Exchange proposes to insert the following new sentence: "Raw percentage price change data as well as percentage price change data normalized for prevailing market volatility, as measured by an appropriate index as agreed by the Commission and the Exchange, would be provided."
- 2) The last sentence of proposed Rule 2009(a)(6) on page 41 of the Exhibit 5 states that: "NQX options will be listed for trading for a pilot period ending 12 months following the date of the first listing of the options." The Exchange proposes to amend this sentence to provide instead that: "NQX options will be listed for trading for a pilot period ending on the earlier of (1) 12 months following the date of the first listing of the options, or (2) June 30, 2019."
